SASI Water Polo Overseas

Seven SASI Water Polo athletes are travelling overseas in the next 2 months to represent Australia at International *Tournaments*.

- Isobel Bishop has been selected to play for Australia at the Junior World Championships in Trieste, Italy in September. This is Isobel's second Junior World Championships with this age group.
- Jessica Martin, Sophie Ricketts and Victoria Risby will be joining Australian team coach Eddie Denis at the World University Games in Shenzhen, China in August.
- Chloe Barr, Belinda Symons and Lucinda Swan will tour with the Australian Born 94 team to Europe in August for training camps in Italy and Greece followed by a 6 Nation International Tournament in Itea, Greece.

WOMEN

- Born94 Women: Chloe Barr, Belinda Symons and Lucinda Swan selected to Australian Squad. Chloe and Belinda will travel to Europe in July as part of a select team.
- Born91 Women: Isobel Bishop is part of the squad preparing for the Junior World Championships in September.
- World Student Games Women: Jessica Martin, Sophie Ricketts and Victoria Risby are part of the squad preparing for the World Student Games in August. SASI Coach Eddie Denis is the coach of this team.

MEN

- Born91 Men: Thomas Dayman is part of the squad preparing for the Junior World Championships in August. Thomas is currently training with the WAIS NTC Water Polo program to maximise his chances of selection for the Junior World Championships.
- Junior Men's Training tour: Paxton Barr, Lachlan Cameron and Louis Steyn have taken the opportunity to travel to Montenegro to train with the Budva club for two weeks in July. This trip is designed to enhance the Water Polo progression of these athletes by providing intensive training in one of the most respected Water Polo training environments in the world.

WATER POLO HIGHLIGHTS FROM 11 February - 18 February 2011

The National League season has started with the two Adelaide Jets teams having already played 4 games a piece.

The Jets Women are currently 1 win - 2 Draws - 1 Loss from their 4 games. Last weekend they played UniNSW for a comprehensive Win in game 1 and a comeback Draw in game 2. Isobel Bishop was outstanding in Game 1 scoring 6 of the teams 9 goals, while Jess Martin was the teams best in game 2.

The Jets Men are currently 0 - 0 - 4 from their 4 games. The team is still searching for cohesion with 3 overseas players joining the young South Australian team. SASI athlete Thomas Dayman has been playing consistently, while Paxton Barr has found a new role at the senior level as a Center Back.

The next Jets games in Adelaide are the 26th and 27th February.

WATER POLO HIGHLIGHTS FROM 1st January - 4th February 2011

Thomas Dayman and William Dayman were dominant forces for South Australia at the recent 20U Nationals in Perth. Thomas finished the tournament equal 5th highest goal scorer for the competition. Thomas attended the Born91 Australian Camp after this event. William at 16 years of age outscored his older brother to finish 3rd on the highest Goal scorers list and was invited to attend the Australian Born93 Camp following the tournament.

Isobel Bishop and Chloe Barr performed well for South Australia at the recent 20U Nationals. Chloe finished equal 9th on the goal scorer's tally, while Isobel, who was nursing a leg injury during the competition, was dynamic in the games in which she was involved. Both Chloe and Isobel stayed for a combined Born91 and Born93 Camp following the 20U Nationals.

The National Water Polo League starts this weekend with the Adelaide Jets teams hosting the Western Australian Torpedoes.

Nine new 'Train-on' athletes have begun training with the SASI Water Polo program. These athletes are on a 2 month Scholarship after which time selection will be made for entry into the full SASI Program.
